With sadness, I make an anonymous report. An activity in my neighborhood, with widespread participation and great support, is presenting a nuisance, as well as safety hazard. A restaurant operation called Selma Café is operating from a single-family residence located at 722 Soule Blvd., Ann Arbor, 6:30-10:00am, every Friday, and sometimes Saturday and Sunday.

A recent Sunday breakfast served 160. Reservations are accepted. Local area chefs are cooks, using area foods, prepared in the residential kitchen. Also, pre-packaged food items are sold in the Selma Café store. A chicken pen and coop are located in the front yard of the residence, with four chickens roaming about, as part of the *attraction*, and advertising.

Possible violations:

Restaurant licensing and inspection (County/State issue)

Single-family zoning accessory use/home occupation violation: More than 10 business-related vehicle trips per day (City issue: chapter 55)

Operation of a group kitchen (City issue: chapter 65)

Operation of an animal show (City issue: chapter 88)

Fence construction without permit (City issue: chapter 104)

Animal nuisance (City issue: chapter 106)

Chicken keeping (City issue: chapter 107)

This report is anonymous due to potential retribution for whistle blowing. The concern is for public safety and health of participants, as well as school children that pass by daily. Eberwhite School is just one house south.

Please investigate the portion of this complaint that falls within your jurisdiction.




