## Faith and Community Leaders Sign-On Letter for Human Services Funding

October 13, 2011

Washtenaw County Board of Commissioners,

As you conclude your budget deliberations, we the undersigned faith and community leaders want to thank you for your continued commitment to support funding for human services in our community. Given the current economic situation, the safety net for the most vulnerable members of our community has never been more insecure or more critical.

The need has never been greater. In the last decade, Washtenaw County's poverty rate has jumped from 11% to over 14%. Our unemployment rate in Michigan is over ten percent. Food Gatherers has seen a 138% increase in the number of families receiving emergency food since 2006. With so many of our residents struggling in this tough economy, it is wonderful to know that you agree that now is the wrong time to cut funding for services they depend on.

As other strands in the social safety net shred, the ones that remain become even more important. At the very time when more families rely on the social safety net to get back on their feet, these same programs face state and federal cuts. As Mary Jo Callan, Director of the Office of Community Development, reported to the Urban County Board, the federal government is planning significant cuts to the Community Development Block Grant and HOME Investment Program, and cuts to other programs are likely.

As you know, the State budget is cutting thousands of Michigan families from the support they receive through the Family Independence Program (FIP) and is making significant cuts to the Earned Income Tax Credit which is so important to low-income working families.

The world's moral and religious traditions share a call to care for the poor and vulnerable. While our varied ethical and religious traditions differ and disagree on some points, we overwhelmingly agree on the need to support those who are in need.

Maintaining the social safety net is good policy. We are fortunate to have community leaders who understand that maintaining human services funding is not just an ethical response to increased need, it is also sound public policy. Money invested in the social safety net saves money in the long-term by preventing more expensive responses such as prison or hospitalization, stabilizes property values by helping prevent eviction and foreclosure, and yields long-term tax revenue by helping people return to and advance in the workforce.

We recognize that you face difficult budget decisions, and we are grateful for your initial decision to

avoid the devastating effects that could come from cutting funds to the most crucial support programs, such as those for children, people with mental illnesses, and the poor.

As faith and community leaders, we thank you and urge your continued support and protection of the safety net that sustains the populations with the most need. It is at the core of who we are as people and our values of caring for every person.

Thank you for the work you are already doing. We are so fortunate to know that we can rely on your willingness to take leadership on these issues.
