Community Survey Overview

Despite Michigan's uncertain economy and decreasing property values, support for public transit remains strong. Almost 80 percent of respondents say public transit is important.

TheRide is well-perceived by the public. Of those who shared an opinion, **90 percent rated**TheRide as favorable.



Nearly half of respondents – **40 percent** – said that they or someone in their family had **used** public transit within the past year.

61 percent support a new 1-mill property tax to fund a countywide public transit agency.

At least 74 percent of respondents listed the following service improvements as either "very" or "somewhat" important:

- 89 percent Door-to-door service for seniors and the disabled;
- **85 percent** A new service using small buses and vans in areas where there are not enough people for regular bus service;
- **84 percent** Existing AATA -- The Ride bus service in Ann Arbor and Ypsilanti would run more frequently, and later in the evening and on weekends.
- 82 percent Express bus service between park and ride lots and employment centers;
- **79 percent** Information on when the next bus is coming would be provided to cell phones and posted on electronic signs at major bus stops.
- **74 percent** An hourly express shuttle bus service would be provided between Detroit Metro Airport and three stops in Ann Arbor including the Blake Transit Center.
