\_\_26. The Ann Arbor Library District may place a bond proposal on a future election ballot to fund major renovations to the downtown library facility or replace that facility with a new building. It is anticipated that the cost will be approximately \$65 million to execute the renovation or new construction project, meaning that the voters of the district would have to approve of a bond proposal to repay the cost of the bonds to finance the project. Such a bond proposal would result in a property tax increase of approximately 0.69 mills, meaning that for every \$200,000 in market value and a taxable value of \$100,000, a typical homeowner would pay an additional \$69 per year, or \$5.75 per month, in property taxes. Knowing this, if the election were held today, would you vote “YES” in favor of the proposal or “NO” to oppose it?
