Public Art Administrator's Report

Justice Center

The drywall, steel and electrical sub-contractors began work in the lobby. Ed Carpenter has scheduled the artwork installation to begin May 25th, over Memorial Day weekend.

More glass pieces have been included in the design and shape of the glass will taper slightly.

Carpenter said:

"All the glass will be 3/16" laminated diachronic that is a blue violet color in transmitted light, shifting to purple and yellow as the angle of view increases. Reflected colors are complimentary."

Roughly 20% of the project's budget will be expensed in the Ann Arbor area, or region.
