Dear Ms. Beaudry,

Michigan Protection and Advocacy Service is the independent agency designated by the Governor of the State of Michigan to advocate and protect the legal rights of people with disabilities. It is the goal of our agency that every eligible resident of this state receive the same access to the polls and the enjoyment of his/her right to vote as does any other voter.

Since the passage of the *Help America Vote Act* of 2002, great strides have been taken to assure that all voters have equal access to the electoral process. However, while much progress has been made, some voters still face barriers at the polls in the form of physical inaccessibility, lack of accessible voting methods, and discrimination from poll workers.

In 2005, you reported to the Bureau of Elections that many of your locations were inaccessible, and yet today continue to use them as polling locations. Last week you verbally agreed to an MPAS staff member that many are still being used, despite accessibility concerns.

We wish to remind you of your obligations under Title II of the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990 ("ADA"), 42 U.S.C. §§12131-12134, Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 ("RA"), 29 U.S.C. §794, the Help America Vote Act of 2002 ("HAVA"), 42 U.S.C. 15301-15545 and state law (MCL §168.662(5)) (together "the Acts"), to ensure that polling places within your jurisdictions are accessible to voters with disabilities.

We have been notified that you have not used the HAVA grant money awarded nearly 2 years ago. Additionally, the Bureau of Elections will not award any additional funds to the city until this has been resolved prior to **September 30, 2009.**

Please respond to MPAS by **September 15, 2009** as to what steps will be taken to utilize these funds. Please contact our office at 1.800.288.5923 and ask to speak with Andrea Rizor to discuss the matter further.

It would be unfortunate to require Ann Arbor residents to pay for improvements that would have been funded by the federal government. We can wait no longer for this to become a priority and will therefore take the necessary steps to ensure compliance if acceleration is not observed.
